This workshop takes a closer look at the value and challenges of creating such partnerships in the field of Continuing Engineering Education – *“What value do partnerships provide? And what are the key challenges in their development?”* In addition to considering a model for partnership development, we shall provide participants with a hands-on opportunity to apply the concepts through working in small teams on a case study of innovative partnership.
