A book of results and best practices from more than 70 organizations was created in January 2011 and distributed at the ASEE CIEC event in San Antonio. On the Move with IACEE's Strategic Plan At the last Executive Committee meeting held at ASEE's CIEC meeting, the strategic plan was used for the first time as a reporting tool. Each of the four IACEE Vice Presidents reported on their area of responsibility within the organization and presented progress being made (and completed!) according to the plan. The Strategic Plan will continue to be a living document that guides our organization and will allow us to show progress toward our goals.

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12th World Conference on CEE Wrap-up

The 12th World Conference on Continuing Engineering Education (WCCEE) was held in Singapore from 17 to 19 October 2010. A total of 99 delegates from 22 countries attended the conference. China's delegation led in number of participants with 43, followed by the USA (15), Japan (7), Singapore (6), Finland (5), and The Netherlands (4). The remaining 16 national delegations numbered either (1) or (2). Of the 99 delegates, 40 were non-IACEE members; these were all awarded a one-year Individual Membership effective with the start date of the WCCEE. The first two days of the conference were held at the National University of Singapore while the final day involved joint sessions with the Global Engineering Deans Council (GEDC) conference and the ASEE Global Colloquium on Engineering Education (GCEE) held at the Marina Bay Sands Resort.



Over the three days, there were 74 oral presentations. These presentations consisted of 2 award lectures, 2 keynote lectures, 2 invited lectures and 14 parallel sessions. Besides the pre- and post-conference IACEE Council meetings, the biennial IACEE General Membership Meeting was held during the conference on the afternoon of 18 October. The conference banquet was held at the Guild House of the University on 17 October. A noteworthy social event was the joint reception held at the IndoChina Waterfront Restaurant on the evening of 18 October, attracting over 500 delegates from WCCEE, GEDC, GCEE, International Federation of Engineering Education Societies Summit and the Global

Student Forum. This is the first time ever that engineering education stakeholders ranging from engineering deans, academics, continuing engineering education providers, professional societies to students got together for technical sessions and social events under the umbrella of the five components of the World Engineering Education Forum (WEEF).

Overseas publicity for the conference was largely due to the untiring efforts of IACEE Council members, in particular our colleagues from China. Publicity for Singapore and the region could have been better but unfortunately the Local Organizing Committee was tied down and a bit overwhelmed by the other four WEEF events. Verbal feedback from WCCEE delegates has been generally favorable, with many expressing sincere thanks and compliments to the IACEE Council and Local Organizing Committee. They were happy with the arrangements and hospitability for the two days at the University and treasured the unique and valuable experience of mingling with other engineering education stakeholders at the Marina Bay Sands Resort.



1 February 2011 Executive Committee Meeting Highlights

The IACEE Executive Committee met on 1 February 2011 at the ASEE Conference for Industry & Education Collaboration (CIEC) in San Antonio, Texas, USA. Our day-long agenda included the following highlights:

- 1. The transition of our Headquarters operation from ASEE in Washington to Georgia Tech in Atlanta has essentially been completed.
- 2. The Executive Committee reviewed the Report on the 12th World Conference on Continuing Engineering Education (WC-CEE) held in Singapore in October 2010 and discussed how our experience could translate into planning for the 13th WCCEE.
- 3. Two Council members (Tuula Bergqvist and Cheng Jianping) elected in October have had to resign their Council seats. The Executive Committee accepted the appointment of Zhang Guoqing as CACEE representative to the Council and approved Kirsti Miettinen as a replacement for Tuula Bergqvist. The full IACEE Council will act on these changes at its June meeting.
- 4. ASEE Interim Director Lyle Feisel visited the meeting for a brief time and was presented by President Nelson Baker with a Resolution of Thanks to ASEE for serving as IACEE Head-quarters for eight years.
- 5. The Executive Committee conducted an in-depth review of the current membership and developed action items to meet the avowed goal of getting the membership database up to date by 31 March.

- 6. A Financial Report was presented that indicated IACEE is fundamentally "on budget" for the current year.
- 7. Nelson Baker introduced the spreadsheets recently developed by Sue Bray to track our progress against strategic goals.
- 8. Progress on two major IACEE Projects (DAETE and CEE Manager Training) was reviewed.
- 9. Preliminary plans for the 13th WCCEE in Valencia, Spain were reviewed and comments were passed back to General Chair of the conference, Patricio Montesinos.
- 10. Council Member Louk Fennis and Member Soma Chakrabarti presented a list of 39 recommendations for improvement of the new IACEE website. Louk and Soma will continue to collaborate in the step-by-step improvement of the site.
- 11. A number of membership development efforts were discussed and will be formulated for the June Council meeting.

The complete approved Minutes of this Executive Committee Meeting were distributed to the IACEE membership on 27 February and they are also posted on the IACEE website under the **Officer/Staff** tab.

Membership Database Updates

A great deal of work has been done to update the IACEE membership database since the transfer of IACEE's Headquarters from Washington to Atlanta last autumn. In September 2010 approximately 640 membership records were transferred from an Access database at ASEE to the Membership Management System of Vieth Consulting, with whom we contracted for website and membership services in September. Because many of these records had not shown any activity in the most recent 4-5 years, the number of records was then culled to slightly less than 200

by January 2011. We have now reduced the number of remaining potential membership "drops" to approximately forty. These forty were assigned to various IACEE Council members for followup at the recent Executive Committee meeting. Our avowed goal is to achieve a viable, active, and up-to-date membership of 160-180 institutions and individuals by 31 March 2011. Hopefully, by the end of this month we will have a membership database that is in excellent shape and we will be able to focus on the recruitment of new members for the remainder of the year!

IACEE Financial Report

While our Headquarters was housed with the American Society for Engineering Education (ASEE) from 2002-2010, financial reporting was done using ASEE Income and Expense categories, many of which did not apply to IACEE. Over the past three months we have developed a simplified one-page spreadsheet tailored to IACEE's Income and Expense categories that provides an excellent snapshot of our financial standing at any point in time.

For the five months dating from 1 October 2010 through 28 February 2011, the following financial breakdown is shared:

New IACEE Website

Since last autumn, when IACEE President Nelson Baker introduced IACEE's new website during the General Membership Meeting in Singapore, the website has been hosted by a small company (Vieth Consulting) that specializes in offering webbased solutions to non-profit organizations and associations. For member-based organizations, like IACEE, they offer their Membership Management System (MMS). MMS consists of a set of online tools that allows IACEE to manage membership records and dues, handle event registration, and easily update website content. The many MMS functions are available to us at a very reasonable fee.

After loading all IACEE information onto the new site (text, membership records, calendar events, past newsletters, past meeting minutes, etc.), the site is very promising, but still far from perfect. Broken links, information in the wrong place or on the wrong page, illogical menu sequences, invalid member information are but a few of the items that need to be fixed, improved and updated.

During the last few months of 2010 Louk Fennis and Soma Chakrabarti collaborated on the generation of a list of 39 items that need to be fixed on the new website. Most of this work has been or will be done by Council Member Louk Fennis (louk@fennis.eu), IACEE Member Soma Chakrabarti (schakrab@ku.edu), Secretary General Frank Burris (f.burris@iacee.org), and President Nelson Baker (n.baker@iacee.org).

We now have an inventory of most of the things that need attention. We shall fix them during the next couple of months and we welcome your comments and suggestions for changes. While our wish list for changes is lengthy, at present a shortage of resources will limit our changes to those that we can accomplish on our own. IACEE's website, informative and interactive as it already is, will soon be improved to benefit the cooperation between IACEE members and serve the international CEE community.



Tsinghua University welcomes this year's Centenary Celebration, while taking it as an opportunity to vigorously promote education support, outstanding academics and social services. Based on the sustainable development of interdisciplinary activities, in-

novation and internationalization, Tsinghua is very dedicated to enriching the future for the revitalization of the Chinese nation and the betterment of humankind.

The Tsinghua Centenary Year began officially on April 25, 2010 at the celebration of the 99th anniversary, and will conclude at the end of July in 2011. 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Tsinghua University School of Continuing Education (SCE)



Established in 1985, the School of Continuing Education, Tsinghua University is the first continuing education school in China approved by the Chinese Ministry. It takes responsibility for leveraging education resources to serve society's needs. The School, relying on the University's excellent faculty resources, solid research foundation and extensive international cooperation network, provides high-quality, multi-level educational programs. These programs utilize modern technologies, mak-

ing due contribution to the building of a life-long education system and learning society in China. It is dedicated to providing on-the-job training and continuing education to civil servants and corporate managers on business management, public policy and management, society and culture, engineering technologies, etc. in various industries.

Every year about 60,000 to 80,000 people take part in the face-to-face training program at Tsinghua SCE with certificates awarded. More importantly, with its Education-Aiding-the-Poor Program, Tsinghua SCE provides free continuing education to about 180,000 people in poverty-stricken areas in China every year. In addition, the number of participants for its distance training programs without certificates reaches nearly 1 million each year, with over 1,000 corporate clients.



Tsinghua SCE has established partnerships for cooperative education programs with organizations in the US, UK, Australia, France, Germany, Japan, Korea, Finland, Sweden, etc. The UNESCO Chair for Continuing Engineering Education in China is also in the School. SCE also seeks international cooperation and exchange through its active involvement in IACEE, ASEE and AEESEAP.

Thematic Studies Plan Adopted by the Pan American Academy of Engineering - API

During its last plenary meeting held on 21-22 October 2010 in Buenos Aires, Argentina, the Pan American Academy of Engineering approved a Permanent Plan of Thematic Studies in reference to the development of engineering and its significant impact to the countries of the Americas. This "Action Plan" was declared a personal responsibility of participation by the actual 124 Academicians and international Associate Members of the Academy.

Four study groups were created and one among them has a specific link of interest to IACEE: The Accreditation of the Practice of Engineering. Economic integration in the Americas is considered a reality and there are various regional plans in operation. Engineers' mobility will become important for such a process and the

establishment of an accreditation system, academic and professional, considering the quality of the graduate and the continuing education of engineers, shall be adopted by the countries of the American continents.

The study groups will develop their work by coordinated virtual contacts. If considered necessary and convenient, in some situations a study group may organize face-to-face Symposia or Seminars. In the future the summary of the groups' activities shall be kept on the Academy's **website**.

The Thematic Studies will result in printed documents, which will also be accessible by electronic means.

DAETE Project Update

IACEE has been developing the tools for the DAETE and DAETE2 Projects. It is intended that members benefit from the possibilities offered by the services the association can deliver. In short, the tools provide support for self-assessment of Lifelong Learning and Continuing Engineering Education organizations, for benchmarking the organizations' overall performance, and to provide access to peer reviews and counseling. IACEE members have different options concerning the degree of involvement in the project. IACEE Vice President, Products & Services Kim Scalzo is in charge of creating a group to manage, support and promote the IACEE Project activities. Alfredo Soeiro has been appointed DAETE Project Manager for IACEE and is leading the IACEE project team coordinating the implementation of DAETE for IACEE members.

The level of involvement of members in the DAETE Project is represented by the three participation levels: Public User, Benchmarking User, and Developer.

- a) Public User: A self-selecting membership taking advantage of the free access to the DAETE tools and choosing to enter their institutions' results and data into the DAETE system primarily for self-assessment with access to benchmarking at the criteria level.
- b) Benchmarking User: A self-selecting membership paying an annual fee to IACEE to be part of the DAETE project activities that have access to deeper levels (sub-criteria) of project data submission and query. This group also becomes part of the formal user community polled to provide input into future project direction.
- c) Developer: Membership is determined by self-selecting IACEE annual membership at the developer's level. This group has all the rights and abilities of the Benchmarking Users plus the ability to vote on adopting new additions to the base IACEE implementation and to vote for requesting

support of research for new additions that can be considered for future adoption.

The public website of IACEE will support the access to multiple levels of services:

- a) Public User: free access to input/limited query (benchmarking at the criteria level only);
- b) Benchmarking User: paid level of user; has access to public information as well as information only for benchmarking users (benchmarking at the sub-criteria level), including best practices:
- c) Developer: paid level of user, more than benchmarking user; has access to benchmarking level users information plus information only for developers.

Those members interested in the DAETE tools and services should complete these forms:

- General Demographic Data
- Supplemental Demographic Data
- Self-Assessment Matrix
- Best Practices

This information provided by members will be stored and analyzed to allow comparison and benchmarking according to the expressed intentions of the participating organization. Several case studies are available for analysis of performance with good results. The selection of the materials can be made based on the dimension and type of organization and comparison can be established with identical organizations.
